# **FINAL PUBLIC NOTICE**

The Coastal Community Action, Inc. has applied for Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Public Assistance (PA) Program funding through the North Carolina Emergency Management (NCEM) as a sub-recipient.

Under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), federal actions must be reviewed and evaluated for feasible alternatives and for social, economic, historic, environmental, legal, and safety considerations. Under Executive Order (EO) 11988 and EO 11990, FEMA is required to consider alternatives, and to provide a public notice of any proposed actions in or affecting floodplains or wetlands. EO 12898 also requires FEMA to provide the opportunity for public participation in the planning process and to consider potential impacts to minority and low-income populations. This notice may also fulfill requirements under Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA).

Funding for the proposed project will be conditional upon compliance with all applicable federal, tribal, state, and local laws, regulations, floodplain standards, permit requirements and conditions.

**Special Flood Hazard Area Zone:** This project is for the removal and replacement of the Duffyfield Child Development Center's (CDC) aluminum fascia, vinyl siding, and roof (tongue and grove decking and TPO membrane), which is located in an AE zone. Confirmation of location in a Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA) was determined by Craven County Preliminary Flood Insurance Rate Map, Panel Number: 3720558000K, dated 11/30/2018. The proposed work conforms to all applicable State of North Carolina and local floodplain regulations. The proposed work will not take place in wetlands per the United States Fish and Wildlife Service National Wetlands Inventory and will have little potential to impact or affect wetland values. There is a potential for the facility to be impacted by future flooding events due to its location within the AE zone.

### **Proposed Work and Purpose:**

The Coastal Community Action, Inc will remove and replace aluminum fascia, vinyl siding, tongue and grove decking and TPO membrane at the Duffyfield CDC. Duffyfield CDC helps provide education classes for the community's children. Mitigation will be implemented through installing elastomeric sheeting and adhesive material to help waterproof the buildings roof. As such, the useful life of this structure should increase and no adverse impacts to the floodplain should occur.

## **Project Alternatives:**

**Alternative #1** (no action alternative): The 'no action' alternative would ultimately result in a negative impact on Costal Community Action, Inc. If the damaged roof is not repaired, then adverse economic and social impacts may occur.

Alternative #2 (Repair in-kind): Repairing the roof without the improvement of waterproofing may result in similar damages from future events. If similar damages occur again, it would cause adverse economic and social impacts.
